# BULLYING



Bullying- The repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power.

- Causes physical or emotional harm to the victim or damage to the victim's property;
- Places the victim in reasonable fear of harm to him/ herself, or of damage to his/her property;
- Creates a hostile environment at school for the victim;
- Infringes on the rights of the victim at school; or
- Materially and substantially disrupts the education process or the orderly operation of a school

### CYBER-BULLYING



Cyber-Bullying- Bullying through the use of technology or any electronic communication, which shall include, but shall not be limited to, any transfer of signs, signals, writing, images, sounds, data or intelligence of any nature transmitted in whole or in part by a:

- Wire
- Radio
- Electromagnetic (Airdrop)
- Photo-electronic or photo-optical system, including, but not limited to, electronic mail, internet communications, instant messages or facsimile communications



#### **ELECTRONIC DEVICE POLICY**

- Electronic Devices include but not limited to: cell phones, Apple Watches with cell phone service, wireless speakers, AirPods/wireless headphones
- Devices must remain in your bookbag for the time you are in school. Bookbags stay in your locker. No cell phone usage is allowed during the school day.
- If you have an emergency and need to contact your parent, you can make an emergency call in the main office



#### ELECTRONIC DEVICE POLICY

- There will be one verbal warning
- The second time a student is found using an electronic device during the school day, it will be confiscated and submitted to the Main Office. The student can retrieve their device at the end of the school day.
- The third time a student is found using an electronic device during the school day, it will be confiscated and submitted to the Main Office. The students parent can retrieve their device at the end of the school day.
- The fourth time a student is found using an electronic device during the school day, it will be confiscated and submitted to the Main Office. The students parent will have to come to the school for a meeting with the Dean. Electronic Device Support Plan will be created.

#### PASSES/BATHROOM/NURSE

- If you are in the hallways at anytime you must have a pass (no roaming, no skipping class)
- One student out of a classroom at the time
- Teachers must call the nurse prior to sending a student down (Emergency)
- Students must sign out of the class

#### LOCKERS

- Every student will receive a locker from their advisory teacher
- There will be a \$5.00 deposit fee for the lock. Which will replace one broken or lost lock.
- All things will be in your bag that will go in your locker
- One locker per student. No extra lockers!!
- All locks have to be returned to their advisory teacher at the end of the year
